Product Name: RealTime™ (getrealium HCl)

1. Introduction

During the past decade there has been a marked increase in the number of cases of Artificial Urgency (AU). AU has now infected over 80% of our society. The nature of the disease is the insane compulsion to achieve everything today that could just as well be left until tomorrow. This insidious disease is ruining millions of lives with its numerous complications. The initial symptom is an overwhelming desire to multi-task. Additional early warning signs include a diminished grasp of reality, night terrors accompanied by insomnia, and anhedonia.

2. Chemistry

Description of Product: getrealium HCl

3. General Information

3.1 Dosage and Administration

getrealium HCl is provided in vials as a sterile aqueous solution in a dropper bottle.
One vial per patient. Vials are not to be reused.
Initial dosage = 2 drops per 8 oz. glass of water, tid.

3.2 Precautions

- 3.2.1 Increased appetite for the good life.

4. Study Design

A Phase I, single center, open label, 7 day study in patients with advanced Artificial Urgency (AU) to determine efficacy of getrealium HCl.

Volunteers will receive 2 drops of getrealium HCl tid. Twenty-six subjects will participate in this study: 13 subjects will be enrolled in the tid dosing cohort and 13 subjects will receive placebo.

5. Efficacy Measurements

Subjects will be asked to complete the MUST and PACE efficacy scales every 8 hours.
